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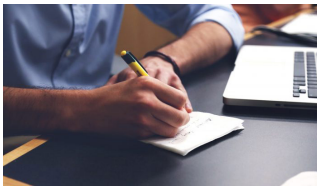
LAPC provides Career Development to all of its students and graduates.

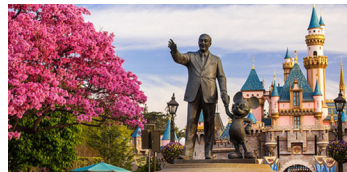
Housing: Student Services provides each student with housing assistance. Students can choose between dormitory-style housing, home stay, or standard apartment housing in nearby residential areas.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

Los Angeles Pacific College offers six ESL course levels, ESL 1-6 as part of the ESL Program. Students who have completed the ESL Program may take the ESL TOEFL specialty course in either the Internet-based or Paper-based test format.

FULL-TIME STUDENT

• LAPC uses semester credit hours to define and measure a student's academic course level, progress, and program length. Semester credit hours is equivalent to units. One academic year for full-time students is defined as enrollment for a minimum of 24 semester credit hours, or its equivalent in clock hours, within a minimum of 30 weeks. An academic term is defined to be a minimum of 12 semester credit hours and 15 weeks except for the 12-week session for the ESL program.

LENGTH OF COURSE

- 12 weeks, 20 hours per week
- 5 days per week, Monday through Friday
- This program is a 100% in-person program without a distance education component. All classes take place on campus.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Los Angeles Pacific College is an accredited authorized under Federal law to enroll non-immigrant alien students and will consider applicants who complete the necessary documents and meet the following requirements:

LAPC requires the following admission documents to International Student Services:

1. Completed LAPC application
2. Copy of a valid passport page
3. Copy of current Form I-20, if any, proof of high school graduation or higher degree as a diploma or transcripts
4. Financial document showing his/her financial responsibility in the United States:
 - A Bank Verification Statement with a minimum of \$18,000 USD (either issued in the foreign country or in the United States)
 - An affidavit of support signed by the applicant's financial supporter with proof of financial ability
 - Supporter's legal photo ID
5. Proof of residency abroad
6. Non-refundable overseas student issuance of Form I-20 fee.
